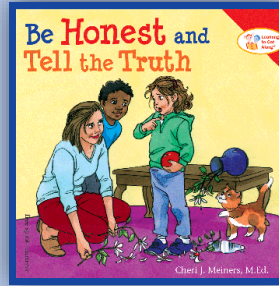




Truth or Lie

To confess that they had lied.*

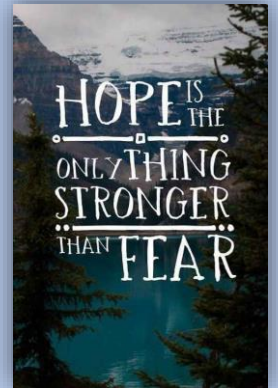
